IBSL Professional Programme - 2023

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1. Introduction to IBSL Professional Programme 2023

With the objective of offering a complete set of qualifications to those already employed in the banking and finance industry as well as those who aspire to enter this prestigious industry with required knowledge, skills and exposure to lead a promising career, IBSL Launched its revised curriculum in the year 2023.

The new professional programme comprised of two stages, namely “Diploma in Banking and Finance (DBF)” and “Higher Diploma in Banking and Finance (HDBF)”

(i) Diploma in Banking and Finance (DBF)

The DBF qualification is the intermediate stage in the professional pathway and provides the foundation for a career in banking and finance focusing on the operational environment, basic characteristics, concepts, theoretical background, and basic managerial aspects related to the Banking and Financial services sector. Table 01 below shows the subjects in the DBF programme.

(ii) Higher Diploma in Banking and Finance (HDBF)

HDBF is the final stage of the professional path and is designed to expose the aspirants to more advanced materials on operations of Banking and Financial services with more emphasis on managerial aspects of different types, mainly focusing on compliance and customer services. Table 02 below shows the subjects in the HDBF Level.

2. Granting of exemptions

With the purpose of providing lateral entry to the IBSL Professional Programme 2023, IBSL grants exemptions for the Diploma in Banking & Finance (DBF) by waving off possible subjects based on the Exemptions Schemes of IBSL. The exemptions schemes are developed by IBSL considering the prior learning gained from Bachelor's Degree programmes offered by state universities, non-state higher education institutions recognized by the University Grants Commission (UGC), foreign universities recognized by the UGC, Professional Qualifications in the Management stream and any other relevant qualifications in the management stream accepted by the IBSL as well as considering other relevant factors applicable for granting exemptions.

Further, in developing exemption schemes, IBSL takes into consideration the prevailing curriculum of the relevant degree or professional programme at the time of application. In the event of any subsequent curriculum revision by the respective educational institutions, holders of such qualifications are required to formally communicate the revised details to IBSL in order to facilitate a review and where appropriate, a revision of the applicable exemptions scheme.

The final decision for exemptions will be based on the discretionary powers of IBSL and binding on all applicants accordingly.

3. Who are eligible to obtain exemptions

Candidates from the following categories are eligible to obtain exemptions based on the Exemptions Policy of IBSL.

4. General guidelines for exemptions

- (i) This exemptions policy is applicable for the IBSL Professional Programme 2023.
- (ii) Exemptions are granted only for the subjects in the Diploma in Banking Finance (DBF). No exemptions are granted for subjects in the Higher Diploma in Banking and Finance (HDBF).
- (iii) Exemptions are granted based on the IBSL Exemptions Scheme. There can be changes to this exemptions scheme based on the revisions in the IBSL curriculum as well as the curricula of the relevant educational qualifications and other relevant factors considered by IBSL.
- (iv) Exemptions are granted for fully completed qualifications recognized by IBSL and part qualifications are not considered for exemptions.
- (v) Exemptions are granted only if the qualifications provide the required level of competencies gained through the respective qualification based on the discretion of IBSL. No exemptions are granted for qualifications that do not contain sufficient and relevant coverage of the subjects in the IBSL Professional Programme.
- (vi) IBSL does not grant exemptions for full qualifications / Memberships obtained from other education institutes through exemptions route.
- (vii) Exemptions are not granted for failed subjects at the IBSL examinations.
- (viii) Candidates are allowed to apply for exemptions after registering as a student.
- (ix) No certificate will be issued for exemptions granted other than the '*Exemptions Confirmation Note*' generated by My IBSL.
- (x) In the official transcripts issued by the IBSL, exempted subject(s) will be denoted as "EX".

5. Exemption Fees

- Students are required to pay Rs. 6,500.00* for each exempted subject through the My IBSL Portal.
- No cash payments / bank transfers are accepted for processing exemptions.

*This fee is subject to change with IBSL's periodical price revisions.

6. Documents to be submitted to apply for exemptions

Applicants are required to submit the following documents when applying for exemptions.

(i) State Universities / Non-State Higher Education Institutes:

- Official transcript
- Detailed course outlines (if requested by the IBSL for a mapping)

(ii) Foreign Universities

- Official transcript
- Detailed course outlines
- *“Letter of Recognition” issued by the University Grants Commission* confirming the recognition of the degree programme by the UGC.

(iii) Professional Qualifications

- Certified copy(ies) of the certificate(s) of the qualification(s)
- Official transcript(s)
- Any other official letters issued by the relevant educational institutes wherever applicable.

Certification of Documents

Certifying the above mentioned certificates / transcripts as true copies can be done by the following persons:

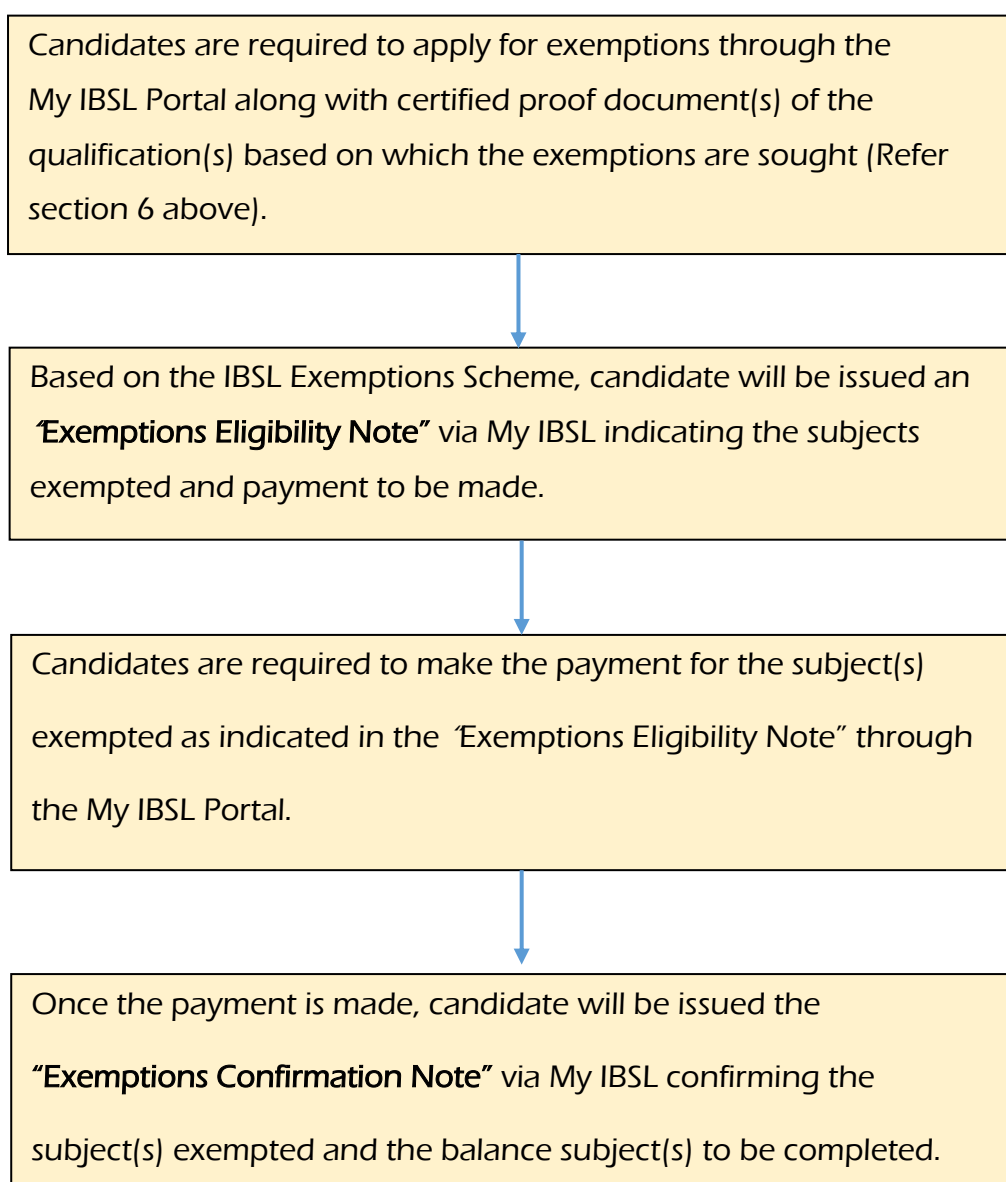
- Examination Department of the University / Higher Education Institute; or
- Relevant Authority of the Professional Education Body; or
- Head of the Department / Head of HR / Branch Manager / Manager or above grade officer of the Employer; or
- Attorney at Law; **With the official rubber stamp.**

Important Note:

If the applicant's name appearing on the relevant certificate / transcript is different from the name given for the registration with the IBSL, he/she is required to attach an Affidavit obtained from an Attorney at Law along with the application.

7. Process of applying for exemptions

The operationalization of the exemptions granting process is carried out as follows.



8. Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

(i) **Can I obtain exemptions without registering as a student at IBSL?**

No. Only registered students of IBSL are eligible to obtain exemptions.

(ii) **When can I apply for exemptions?**

Candidates can apply for exemptions after registering as a student with IBSL. However, they must ensure that they apply for exemptions before sitting for the examination of the respective subject.

(iii) **How can I obtain information about the exemptions scheme of IBSL?**

IBSL has developed an exemptions scheme for recognized academic and professional qualifications. Applicants can contact the Deputy Director – Examination and obtain information about their qualifications accordingly.

(iv) **My qualification is not listed in the IBSL Exemptions Scheme. How can I know the exemptions for my qualification?**

For any qualification that is not included in the exemptions scheme of the IBSL, the candidate is required to submit scanned copy(ies) of the official transcript(s) along with the official detailed curriculum (Course outlines) issued by the relevant education institute to exemptions@ibsl.lk for an assessment of the qualification(s).

(v) **Is there a validity period for the exemptions granted?**

This exemptions policy has been developed based on the IBSL Professional Programme 2023 curriculum and hence the exemptions policy is valid until this curriculum remains effective.

(vi) **Can I apply for exemptions based on more than one qualification?**

Yes. Candidates are allowed to submit multiple qualifications when applying for exemptions and the maximum subject exemptions will be granted based on the IBSL Exemption Scheme.

- (vii) **I have some subjects pending in my degree / professional programme. Can I obtain exemptions with the undertaking of completing them in future?**

No. Exemptions are granted only for completed degree / professional programmes at the time of applying for exemptions.

- (viii) **I have attempted and failed in X subject(s) in the IBSL Professional Programme before. However, now I have completed a relevant degree / professional programme stated in the IBSL exemptions scheme. Can I obtain exemptions for such failed subjects?**

No. You cannot obtain exemptions for previously failed subjects in the IBSL Professional Programme.

- (ix) **I have sat for examinations in IABF under the 2014 syllabus. Can I apply for exemptions under the Exemptions Policy of 2023 Syllabus?**

Yes. In this case, the applicant should obtain the transfer credits from IABF to DBF curriculum and apply for exemptions under the Exemptions Policy of 2023 curriculum. Thereafter, applicant should continue the studies under the DBF of the 2023 curriculum.

Note: If a student has failed in a subject in the IABF that is similar to the subject in the DBF curriculum, that subject(s) will not be exempted. Applicant is required to sit and pass that subject(s).

- (x) **If I have completed the study programme and pending the final certificate / transcript of the degree programme / professional qualification, how can I apply for exemptions?**

In the event where a candidate is pending the final certificate / transcript of the degree programme / professional qualification, he/she may attach the following documents as proof of the completion of the said qualification.

- **State Universities / Non-State Higher Education Institutes:**
 - Results confirmation letter issued by the Examination Department indicating that you have successfully completed the degree programme.

- **Foreign Universities:**
 - Results confirmation letter issued by the Examination Department / relevant authority of the foreign university indicating that you have successfully completed the degree programme. **And**
 - *Letter of Recognition issued by the University Grants Commission* confirming the recognition of the degree programme by the UGC.

- **Professional Programmes:**
 - Results confirmation letter issued by the Examination Department / relevant authority of the professional body indicating that you have successfully completed the study programme.

(xi) What is the deadline for applying for exemptions?

The deadline for applying for exemptions for each examination session will be notified to students via the IBSL official website.

Candidates are required to apply for exemptions via MYIBSL portal along with the supporting documents as per section 06 above **on or before deadline applicable for the examination session.**

(xii) Can I obtain a certificate for the exemptions granted?

No. IBSL does not issue any certificate for exemptions granted other than the “*Exemptions Confirmation Note*” issued via MYIBSL Portal.

Certificates are only issued for successful level completion by sitting for examinations of the IBSL Professional Programme.

(xiii) What’s next after obtaining exemptions?

Once the student obtains the Exemptions Confirmation Note, he/she can proceed with the remaining examinations by following the standard procedure of applying for examinations via the My IBSL Portal.
